Refunds
 There is a \$100 non-refundable deposit for every camp session.

Refunds for the camp fee, minus the \$100 deposit, are made only for cancellations received in writing at least three weeks prior to the opening day of the camp session. Refunds will be considered for documented illness or a family emergency. A camper who does not arrive, arrives late, leaves early, or attends only a part of the session will not receive a refund.

Upon arrival at camp, the camp medical staff will evaluate all campers. If a camper is too ill to attend camp, the parent must take the child home. A refund will be considered, minus the \$100 deposit. In the event a camper becomes ill at camp and is sent home at the discretion of the camp medical staff, no refund will be issued.

Note: All refunds are subject to review and will take time to process.

Accommodations
 4-H Camp Wabasso is located in the Indian River Lakes region of Jefferson County and features 177 wooded acres, a nature pond, and a half mile of sandy beach on Millsite Lake. Campers are housed in cabins with a minimum of three other campers and at least one senior counselor, depending on cabin size. Cabins are newly updated and equipped with lights and smoke detectors. Beds and mattresses are provided with campers providing the bedding. Toilets and hot showers are located in the bathhouse. There are separate accommodations based on gender identity, with cabin assignments based on appropriate age ranges. Since the camp is located in the woods, campers should not be surprised to find the occasional chipmunk under the cabin or spider in the bathroom.

NOTE: 4-H Camp Wabasso is permitted to operate by the New York State Department of Health; including periodic on-site inspections. The inspection reports are filed at the local New York State Department of Health, Dulles State Office Building, 317 Washington Street, Suite 2, Watertown, NY 13601-3768.

Leader-in-Training (LIT)

The Leader-in-Training classes are for campers who are 13 or 14 years old. LIT classes teach essential life skills to help campers become better leaders, such as presenting to a group, teamwork, problem solving and conflict resolution. Campers in this age group will be able to choose this class after they are registered for camp, once class selection opens on UltraCamp.

Junior-Counselor-in-Training (J-CIT)

J-CIT classes are offered to campers ages 15 and 16. Campers will learn teaching techniques and leadership skills to prepare to become future counselors and leaders. Campers will be able sign up for this class after they are registered for camp, once class selection opens on UltraCamp.

Senior-Counselor-in-Training (S-CIT)

The S-CIT program is for campers age 16 who are interested in developing their leadership and teaching skills even further than LIT and J-CIT! S-CIT's shadow counselors, work on special projects, and help with other class activities. Campers must fill out an online application (found at 4hcampwabasso.org) and interview for this program.
